WATERFORD'S QUILT SHOW TO FEATURE QUILTS SPANNING THREE CENTURIES

SPOKANE, Wash. — Quilt enthusiasts will breathe the fresh scent of creativity and fun at Waterford on South Hill's "A Walk Through a Garden of Quilts." The seventh annual quilt show will feature more than 150 quilts on display, presentations by local experts, prizes and a variety of quilting materials for sale. The show runs Thursday, March 30 and Friday, March 31 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Waterford on South Hill, 2929 S. Waterford Drive (corner of 29th and Pittsburg).

There is no admission fee, and the event is opened to the public. People will enjoy:

- **Quilting presentations.** Keynote speaker Pamela Mostek, from Making Lemonade Design, will present two lectures. On Thursday at 10 a.m., she will speak about "The Wonderful World of Wool Felt;" on Friday at 2 p.m., her topic will be "Beyond Slice and Dice."
- **Demonstration.** Suzi Hokonson, from Suzi's Hang Art, will give two hang-art demonstrations—Thursday at 2 p.m. and Friday at 10 a.m. Each one will demonstrate how people can combine heirloom items, such as tatting, crocheting and a person's picture, to convey a story about someone's life.
- **More than 150 quilts on display.** People will be able to view quilts from the nineteenth, twentieth, and twenty-first centuries as well as vote for their favorite quilt and win prizes.
- **Local vendors.** The Quilting Bee, Hummer Dog and Suzi's Hang Art will sell materials and ready-to-make projects.
